Justice is supposed to be blind, but judges are not. Yet, it appears that many judges and prosecutors in Florida have chosen to ignore or bypass a law which was passed by the 1975 Florida Legislature and called for a minimum, mandatory prison term of at least three years for anyone using a firearm while committing murder, sexual battery, robbery, burglary, arson, aggravated assault, kidnapping, escape or aircraft piracy. The minimum sentence was three years, and terms could go up to life.

Senate Bill 55 was hailed as a deterrent to crime, and many other states went about passing similar

legislation. The Florida Sheriffs Association, the Attorney General's Office and the Florida Outdoor Advertising Association mapped out a criminal awareness campaign for 1976 consisting of TV and radio announcements, roadside billboards, news releases and posters for the doors of often-robbed businesses.

As Sheriffs Association President Frank Cline points out in his President's Message (page 1), the Three-Years-to-Life law seemed to work for awhile, but is now being ignored. The public is paying the price, and Sheriff Cline is not happy about it.

President's Message

"Statistics . . . made me mad as hell"

I saw some statistics the other day that made me mad as hell. These figures revealed that only about 30 percent of the gun-toting criminals sent to prison in Florida during the past four years have been sentenced under a law designed to crack down on crimes involving guns and other deadly weapons.

This law requires judges to give armed criminals who commit certain serious crimes at least three years in prison with no hope of parole or probation during that mandatory time.


It is a tough law and a good law. It was passed in 1975 with strong support from the Florida Sheriffs Association. We called it the "three-years-to-life" (TYTL) law, and we publicized it statewide through billboards and the media to make certain it would deter armed hoodlums.

Our efforts paid off dramatically for a little while. In 1976, the year after the TYTL law was passed, armed robberies dropped 28.2 percent, and all violent crimes dropped 5.5 percent; but the trend soon reversed and, since 1977, robberies and violent crimes have been increasing at an accelerating rate. In the first nine months of 1979, armed robberies increased 19.9 percent; murder with handguns increased 20.3 percent; and shotgun murders increased 39.9 percent.

The TYTL law worked for one year and then stopped working, and I know why: because certain judges and prosecutors began ignoring it or bypassing it. They're still doing it. Judges don't like it because it takes away some of their discretion in serious cases. Prosecutors are prone to use it as a handy plea bargaining tool.

Sheriffs have known this was going on, but they didn't know how bad it was until the Department of Corrections figures showed the TYTL law was being used only about 30 percent of the time.

This tells me that about 70 percent of the criminals using guns in crimes are being improperly charged and sentenced. Many of them will be eligible for parole within six months to a year, when they should be serving three years or more.

Some judges are apparently deciding to ignore the TYTL law and are sentencing gun-toting criminals without citing that law. Prosecutors are apparently bypassing the TYTL law by reducing serious charges involving guns to lesser charges during plea bargaining sessions.

The three-year mandatory sentence applies only when guns are used in certain specific crimes such as murder of all degrees, rape, robbery, burglary, arson, aggravated assault, aggravated battery, kidnapping, escape, breaking and entering, and aircraft piracy. When charges are reduced to lesser crimes, the fact that a gun was used does not automatically trigger a mandatory sentence, and the gunman is likely to get off light.

If the TYTL were being properly used, I suspect more armed robbers would be going to prison. In 1978, 5,471 suspects were arrested for all categories of robbery, but only 4,000 went to prison. Thus, 1,471 went free. Some were obviously acquitted, but I wonder how many benefited from plea bargaining, probation and other maneuvers.

When the TYTL law was passed, prison officials braced for a flood of prisoners, but a Department of Corrections official was recently quoted as saying it actually has had no noticeable effect on the prison population, and "no significant impact on our planning (for the future.)"

In the 1973-74 fiscal year, just under 10 percent of Florida's new prisoners were armed robbers. Two years later, immediately after the TYTL law was passed, the

percentage jumped to 18; but it dropped to 10 percent the following year, and to 9.6 percent the year after that.

Meanwhile, Florida's crime rate has increased from 680 violent crimes for every 100,000 residents in 1976, to 734 in 1978.

The "revolving door system" of short prison terms for armed and dangerous criminals is still operating; and the law that was passed to slow it down is not being used.

The TYTL law is an excellent law, but it has not been given a fair shake. Certain judges and prosecutors are not giving it a chance to do what it was intended to do. They are not carrying out the intent of the legislature; they are not living up to their oaths of office to uphold the laws of Florida; and the more I think about it, the madder I get.

70 and still going strong!


The Florida Sheriffs Association will celebrate its 70th anniversary this year. It was founded in 1910 to bring Sheriffs into "closer touch with each other," the charter said.

Florida had 50 counties then, and every one of the state's

50 Sheriffs signed on as a charter member. However, keeping in touch in those "horse and buggy" days proved to be an extremely difficult task, and the newly-organized Association soon lost momentum.

It became inactive about 1915, but was reactivated in 1928 and eventually became a widely-recognized trail-blazer among law enforcement organizations. Over a 50-year span Sheriffs, working together through the Association, developed a state-wide communications network, modernized their crime fighting methods, strengthened criminal laws, founded the unique Florida Sheriffs Bureau which has evolved into today's Florida Department of Law Enforcement, played a leading role in modernizing law enforcement training, helped to elevate the professional standards of law enforcement officers, and created the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, a nationally-famous home for needy and worthy youngsters which has developed into a growing chain of child care institutions operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund.

After 70 years, the Association is still going strong!





Governor

GOVERNOR BOB GRAHAM

Bob Graham, Florida's 38th Governor, is an achiever from a family of achievers. His father, Ernest ("Cap" for World War service) Graham, was a South Dakota mining engineer before he built a dairy and land empire from palmetto and sawgrass "scratch" in Dade County in the 1920's.

The elder Graham became a member of the State Road Board in 1929; later served as a State Senator from Dade County, and ran unsuccessfully for Governor in 1944.

The Governor's brother, Philip, became publisher of the Washington Post; and his brother, Bill, was successful in dairy, land development and cattle businesses.

His aunt, Mrs. Ina S. Thompson, served as State Motor Vehicle Commissioner during the administration of Governor LeRoy Collins — the only woman in the Governor's "little cabinet."

His mother, the former Hilda Simmons, was a school teacher in DeFuniak Springs before she married Ernest Graham and moved to Dade County.

Governor Graham was born November 9, 1936, in Miami; attended public schools in Dade County; and began his political career at Miami High School when he was elected president of the student body.

At the University of Florida, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1959, he was never accused of maintaining a low profile. Alumni from the class of '59 will recall that he was Chancellor of the High Court, on the debate team, attained Phi Beta Kappa and Florida Blue Key through his academic and leadership attainments. He also served as president of Sigma Nu and Phi Eta Sigma fraternities.

He went on to Harvard University and received his law degree there in 1962. Four years later he ran successfully for a seat in the Florida House of Representatives.

In 1970, he was elected to the Florida Senate and demonstrated a talent for the art of lawmaking, especially in the areas of education and health services. After eight years in the Senate, he ran a successful race for Governor and became the first Dade Countian to attain that high office.

During his 12 years in the Florida Legislature many honors came his way. He was the four-time recipient of Allen Morris Awards and also received recognition from the Florida Jaycees, St. Petersburg Times, Tallahassee Democrat, Conservation 70's, Florida Wildlife, Sierra Club, Florida Association of Community Colleges and the Florida School Boards Association.

The Governor's many community services include his participation in the 4-H Youth Foundation, the National Commission on Reform of Secondary Education, the National Foundation for Improvement of Education, the Southern Regional Education Board, the National Committee for Citizens in Education, and Senior Centers of Dade County.

In addition to his professional status as an attorney, Governor Graham has been involved in cattle, dairy and land development ventures. He is Vice President of The Graham Company, a cattle and dairy business; and Chairman of the Board of Sengra Development Corporation, the firm that developed Miami Lakes. According to information released to the media by the Governor's office, Miami Lakes is a new town recognized as an outstanding model of community planning.

Governor Graham is married to the former Adele Khoury, of Miami Springs, and they have four children: Gwen, born January 31, 1963; Glen, March 18, 1964; Arva, July 25, 1967; and Kendall, April 30, 1969.

For recreation, the Governor plays tennis and golf. He also holds a private pilot's license.

During his successful campaign for Governor he vowed to work 100 jobs to get the workingman's point of view, and the media gave extensive coverage to his on-the-job experiences which ranged from the Panhandle oil fields at Jay, to the South Florida tomato fields near Naples.

He has written a book about the campaign. It's titled "Workdays: Finding Florida on the Job."

Lieutenant Governor

WAYNE MIXSON

Tallahassee's Capitol complex is familiar territory to Wayne Mixson, a Jackson County farmer who was sworn in as Florida's Lieutenant Governor on January 2, 1979.

Before he became Governor Bob Graham's running mate in the 1978 election campaign, he served 12 years in the Florida Legislature. For six of those years he was Chairman of the House Agriculture and General Legislation Committee. During his



tenure in the House, he also served on the Appropriations and Rules committees. A variety of groups across the State have honored him for his service to Florida in the Legislature.

Outside the Legislature his public service has included appointments to the Governor's Council on Housing Goals, the Governor's Commission on Property Rights, and the Florida Migrant Labor Commission.

Lt. Governor Mixson holds responsibility in three major areas for the Graham-Mixson Administration. First, he is the State's chief spokesman for economic development. In this capacity he has participated in successful trips to Guatemala, Japan and sites throughout the United States. Secondly, he

served as Chairman of the Governor's Tax Reform Commission and continues to oversee tax policy development in the Administration. Third, he is liaison to locally-elected officials and citizens of the State to their government in Tallahassee.

The Lieutenant Governor was born in New Brockton, Alabama, on June 16, 1922, and became a resident of Florida in 1941. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Florida, where he graduated with honors. He also attended Columbia University and the University of Pennsylvania and holds honorary scholastic membership in Phi Gamma Delta and Phi Kappa Phi fraternities.

He is married to the former Margie Grace of Graceville and operates a working farm between Marianna and Graceville. Mrs. Mixson is a retired English instructor.







The Florida Legislature, composed of the Senate and House of Representatives, is the law-making branch of our government. It meets annually in the Capitol, in Tallahassee, for 60 days. The Legislature also holds extraordinary, or special, sessions. The Governor can call one of these sessions. Senators are elected for four-year terms; Representatives, for two-year terms.

Governor resorts to name calling at Sheriffs Mid-Winter Conference

CRYSTAL RIVER — Seldom had Sheriffs been called so many names. And yet they sat there and took it, with smiles on their faces. At times, they actually applauded, and, when the speaker was through, they gave him a standing ovation.

The speaker was Governor Bob Graham, the date was January 28, 1980, the occasion was the Annual Mid-Winter Conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association, and the place was the Plantation Inn, at Crystal River.

"You are the proud **protectors** of our society," said the Governor. "You are the people who wear American flags on your uniforms as a sign of pride in country and pride in protecting the citizenry. You make the words of the preamble to the U. S. Constitution come alive when it states the need to 'insure domestic tranquility.'"

There was more to come.

"You...will always be partners in my administration," the Governor added. "You are the victors in many battles against malicious, mean and devious forces in this state. You are the troops in the trenches who must battle the drug smugglers who threaten to take over Florida. Someone recently observed in my office that the Sheriffs of this state and throughout the country are the real 'stars' in the American flag."

The Governor was just getting warmed up, and he continued in similar vein by recalling that when truckers went on strike last year, "Sheriffs from throughout the

state moved quickly, carefully and forcefully to protect the public from snipers, threats of violence, and threats to the public welfare."

The Sheriffs of Florida also walked the halls of the capitol to help lobby for a tough mandatory sentencing law for drug smuggling which was passed by the Florida Legislature in 1979, he added.

"We are beginning to see results already from our minimum mandatory sentencing law," he said. "States adjacent to Florida and, even as far away as California, are feeling the effects of the new law. Drug traffickers are apparently fleeing our state to set up shop across state lines."

The Governor reassured Sheriffs that "efforts are being made, and carried out, to increase local cooperation between the State Department of Law Enforcement and Sheriffs' Departments throughout the state."

Looking ahead to the 1980 session of the Florida Legislature, he said he was considering a number of ways to strengthen law enforcement, including bills to broaden the 1979 drug traffic statute; to create tougher penalties for criminal conspiracies; and to make both money and real property seized in criminal cases subject to forfeiture "the same as a car, boat or airplane."

The Governor said he had called upon the Sheriffs for help many times during his first 13 months in office, and it had become necessary for him to seek their help again. Thereupon, he asked Sheriffs to head up "Get out the Vote" campaigns in their respective counties to guarantee a heavy turnout at the polls for the March 11 Florida primary election.

The March 11 ballot is important, the Governor said, because voters will be helping to elect a president and voting on two important Constitutional amendments.

One of the amendments will increase the homestead exemption from \$5,000 to \$25,000 for school taxes and assure the people that property taxes will be frozen for another year, the Governor said. The other, he added, will amend the Judicial Article in Florida's Constitution to reduce the overwhelming number of cases that now must be considered by the Florida Supreme Court, and thus decrease appeals delays.

Sheriffs quickly assured the Governor they would help him get out the vote. To have done otherwise would have been inappropriate after they had just heard him say in his speech: "I can assure you that the Graham administration will always be your friend."

Attorney General agrees that Florida is "Drug Disaster Area"

WASHINGTON, D. C. — It is no exaggeration to describe Florida as a "drug disaster area" Attorney General Jim Smith declared when he testified before the U. S. Senate's Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations.

"No state among the 50 feels more directly the economic and social costs of the drug trade and the criminality surrounding it." he added.

"Through an accident of nature and geography, Florida has become an international port of entry for most of the illicit drugs entering the United States. It is the nearest mainland destination for contraband from Central and South America and the offshore islands. It is a smuggler's paradise."

He said the torrent of narcotics coming into the state has overwhelmed the ability of authorities to dry it up, and he appealed for a higher degree of cooperation between the state and federal governments.

"Barriers to the exchange of. . .information must be eliminated," he added. "Stricter controls on the flow of cash through banks. . .are needed. The licenses of pilots convicted on smuggling charges should be permanently revoked, and the FAA should require aircraft identification numbers large enough to be read near the ground.

"The government should transfer to civil use, or assign to the Coast Guard, sufficient small ocean-going vessels to police the three choke points in the Caribbean and Gulf of Mexico through which smuggling vessels must pass.

"Congress should enact a law permitting the arrest of United States citizens caught with contraband cargoes in international waters.

"Every agency of the federal government needs more staff and better equipment. The thinness of these forces is an indictment of the national government's haphazard approach to the problem," Smith said.

As a final suggestion, Smith urged Congress to take appropriate action so that drug smuggling information gathered through military surveillance can be transferred to state and federal law enforcement authorities. He said he felt this could be done without breaking down the doctrine that prevents direct military involvement in civil law enforcement.

"The law can be amended to allow transfer of information...," he said. "That's all. Information. There would be no involvement of the armed services in prosecuting these cases. The evidence and testimony would be presented by the interdicting agency.

"Florida needs your help," Smith said, and he backed up his appeal by citing some drug traffic statistics.

He said for every pound of drugs seized, nine pounds get through, and the street value of this trade reaches numbers that defy belief.

"Records fall overnight," he said.

"The largest single cocaine haul in United States history was made by customs officers in Fort Lauderdale in October (of 1979) — 329 pounds worth 80 million dollars.

"That record was broken 48 hours later in Tampa when 384 pounds worth 100 million dollars were found in a couple of suitcases tucked in the back of an airplane.

"Seventy percent of the marijuana seized by the Drug Enforcement Administration in the United States last year was impounded in Florida.

"In the past 16 months nine counties in the Florida panhandle, one of the more sparsely populated areas of the state, have seized marijuana worth 84 million dollars.

"Forty percent of the murders in Florida take place in Miami and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement estimates 11.5 percent of these are drug-related.

"We need the help of Congress...in this disaster as much as we ever needed it to recover from the ravages of a hurricane," Smith added.

Wrong again!

Is it true that the typical criminal is a loner, unemployed and on welfare?

No, that's false, according to a federal study showing that only three percent of the U. S. prison population had been on welfare prior to being arrested, and some 77 percent were wage earners.

However, the median income for lawbreakers was considerably lower than that of the average working male.

Three-fifths of all prisoners had lived with relatives before being arrested, and some 86 percent kept contact with family or friends while in prison. There goes the loner image!

Legal rip-offs

A smart confidence man may leave you financially broke without breaking the law.

Consider the man who bought a set of encyclopedias for \$450 from a door-to-door salesman, and then discovered the books were 35 years old. When he finally got around to reading the sales contract, he learned that he had gotten exactly what the contract had promised.

Ponder this information about land purchases from the American Association of Retired Persons:

"No law is broken when a land speculator pays \$700 an acre for 'sunny lots' in the Southwest and sells them through ads in Eastern newspapers for \$5,000 an acre. A piece of land is worth exactly what you can get someone else to pay for it."

Give him what he wants

If you are held up, give the robber what he wants. This is the advice the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) is giving to the elderly.

"Do not resist," the AARP urges. "Never try to fight a robber unless he attacks you. According to police records, robbery victims who do not resist generally are not injured, but there are countless cases of serious personal injury to victims who imprudently threaten or resist in a simple robbery.

"It is madness to seize this moment to throw out a slur or other invective. Be calm and attentive, and give your assailant exactly what he wants.

"Try to remember enough about the robber to give the police a decent description....a distinctive tattoo, a facial scar or a physical deformity. However, if you seem to be memorizing his face, it may give him unpleasant ideas. Always, your primary objective is to preserve your personal safety."
