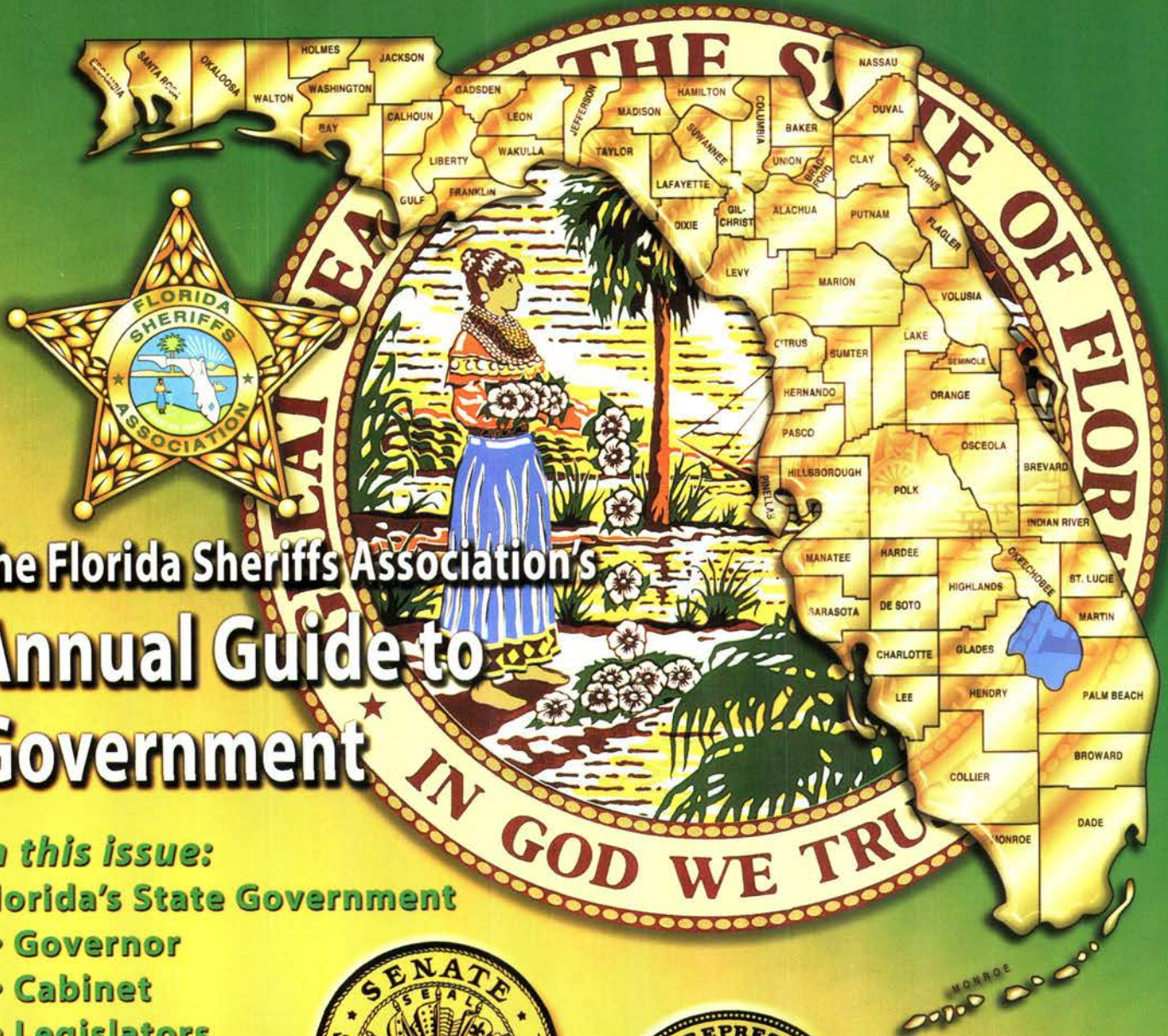

This has been a very challenging year for law enforcement and especially for Sheriffs.

We continue to wrestle with developments that resulted from 9-11. More demands have been placed on local government, such as increased patrols and surveillance at airports, railroads, bridges, electric power plants and ports. At the same time, of course, governments are trying to reduce taxes, which has put a strain on our budgets.

The challenge for us as Sheriffs is how to meet the demands for service with increasingly diminishing resources. We're seeing our employees become more innovative, and in some cases asking the public to compromise on calls for routine service.

Another challenge your Sheriffs have faced this year is the number of law enforcement officers who have been called up to active duty through the Reserves and National Guard. As you are probably aware, we keep those positions unfilled, while our military men and women serve our country. So our manpower is stretched a little thin, at times.

There's a bright spot in all of this, though, in the way of the innovation that I mentioned. With Florida Sheriffs being tapped to head up the Florida Domestic Security Task Force and the efforts of our Florida Department of Law Enforcement, we've been able to increase training and preparedness. And with our very own former Sheriff of Bay County – Guy Tunnell – being tapped to lead FDLE, we are confident that our cooperative efforts with this agency will continue.

As Floridians, we should be proud of the fact that our state has been recognized for being more responsive to homeland security than any other state in the union, so far. At the same time, your Florida Sheriffs have been able to work with other local, state and federal law enforcement agencies to continue the overall downward trend in crime rates.

We believe that one of the keys to that crime rate reduction in the future is sustaining funding for the Department of Juvenile Justice, especially when it comes to the department's Juvenile Assessment Centers. Without the JACs, deputies are given no alternative other than to release these juvenile delinquents back to the street – where they frequently commit multiple crimes while awaiting trial.

Your Sheriffs will be working with Governor Bush and our Legislators in an effort to secure adequate funding to continue to reduce juvenile crime. We hope we can count on your support, as well.

Finally, I would like to thank you for everything you do to reduce crime – primarily through your support of the Florida Sheriffs Association and our sister organization, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Because of you, FSA and the Youth Ranches have become recognized nationally for effectiveness – and we pledge to continue to do our part in promoting public safety and giving hope to the generations to come.

Sexual Predator and Sexual Offender Database

We often read in the news of tragedies involving children who become victims of sexual predators or offenders who had a previous record. To safeguard our communities, the state of Florida passed a law that made it legal to learn if a person found guilty of previous offenses lives in your neighborhood.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement developed one of the first public access systems for searching a database and determining if you should be taking greater precaution with a person living in your neighborhood, or otherwise exposed to your children.

Fraud: Don't Fall For It

Fear is necessary for survival. But we sometimes misallocate our fears. We waste them fretting about things that pose little threat, and virtually ignore more legitimate dangers.

For example, abductions, carjackings, rapes and murders attract the shark's share of attention and fear, while more real, but less spectacular threats lurk with little notice. The truth is that most crooks will never use guns, knives or violence in their crime; they'll instead use wit, charm and personality to steal your cash.

Awareness of these dangers will go a long way in helping you avoid becoming their next victim.

High-tech, newer scams

Identity theft is considered the fastest growing crime in the new century. Sheriffs' Offices hear with increasing frequency from people who have been struggling with collection agencies over someone else's huge bills. Sometimes, it's months before the innocent party has any idea they've been victimized, as many times their identity has been stolen without their knowledge or participation.

The state now has an official "Identity Theft Resource and

Older ones still working, too

There are also older schemes that are still claiming victims. The "left over asphalt" scam is a classic and has many variations. This is where a contractor knocks on the door and claims he was working on another job and just happens to have enough left-over material to re-pave your driveway at a "bargain" price.

Many victims don't know they've been had until the new pavement begins to crack and crumble in a few weeks or months – and this contractor, who clearly used inferior quality materials, is nowhere to be found. Variations of this scam include roofing, painting and other home repairs.

The perpetrator often insists on being paid with cash...and sometimes succeeds in convincing people to pay them up front. In these cases, victims don't need to worry about poor quality materials or workmanship – as the "contractor" will usually take the money and run.

To avoid door-to-door fraud, always be suspicious of deals offering something for nothing or extremely low rates. Use caution with people who want you to make a quick decision about spending money and don't fall for pressure tactics, either overt or subtle. Haste is in their best interest, not yours. Most important, if you suspect fraud or any criminal activity, don't be embarrassed or ashamed to report it immediately to your local Sheriff's Office.

Big cash and foreign letters

Another tried-and-true tactic is to wave a huge amount of money in front of the victim. The "pigeon drop" scam continues to bilk individuals out of thousands of dollars in each instance.

A neatly-groomed, professional appearing, articulate black woman has pulled off this classic fraud three times in Okaloosa County.

She starts by approaching a shopper in a busy parking lot in the daytime with a manila envelope she claims she just found. She thinks it might be yours. She then asks you to watch as she checks inside for any kind of ID. There is no identification, but – surprise – lots and lots of cash, like \$100,000-plus.

After a cellular telephone call, her lawyer or accountant "friend" has explained how you may make a legal claim to the money if the owner doesn't come forward. This involves a deposit of "earnest money" or up-front payment of taxes. The last known victim obtained a \$4,000 cash advance on a credit card before the sophisticated woman stranger vanished.

For about 15 years, we've seen the "Nigerian Letter Scam," in which business or government interests in that nation explain they have millions of dollars for which they positively must find a temporary overseas home. If you will lend them the use of your bank account, you will receive a nice commission. These letters, sent at random, no longer arrive only by mail; faxes and e-mails seem to be the scam artists' method of choice.

Don't fall for it. These schemes are nothing more than excuses for someone to get a hold of your personal information and drain your bank accounts or ruin your credit.

FSA Legislative Preview

Public Safety Issues in 2004

Each fall, the Florida Sheriffs Association's Legislative Committee meets to consider public safety issues that might require legislation to address.

During the legislative session, FSA leadership and a host of Sheriffs will visit with lawmakers and provide testimony to guide their decision-making.

FSA's Director of Governmental Relations, Frank Messersmith, says, "This year, like most, will be challenging in the legislature. But with the direct involvement of the Sheriffs, it's possible to pass the legislation we need for better public safety – and to prevent other legislation from being passed that might be harmful to our communities."

Following is a summary of issues that the Florida Sheriffs will seek to have heard during the 2004 legislative session.

Baker Act Reform (SB700) - SUPPORT

The Baker Act has some inherent problems that the Florida Sheriffs Association is seeking to get fixed.

It's a little known fact that the county jails, on average, house more mentally ill people than all of the state mental health institutions combined. A solution that is being proposed is court-ordered community based treatment (assisted outpatient treatment) to take recidivists out of the system and prevent our jails from becoming mental hospitals.

Under the current law, a judge's only option is hospitalization at \$100,000+ per year. Yet, the most expensive community based treatment is only about \$10,000 per year. Revision would provide a judge the option for the less expensive treatment. Florida is one of only nine states without this option.

In addition, because the Baker Act requires "evidence" of a person's dangerousness, it too often means that intervention comes too late. People get injured or killed – including family of the mentally ill person or law enforcement called to intervene – before anything is done.

FSA's proposed revisions would allow earlier inter-

vention for recidivists – people with repeated incidents of hospitalization, arrests and dangerousness. More than half of the states currently have a more flexible standard than Florida. Recidivists also use a disproportionate share of public services. In the year 2000, 7,500 adults were Baker Acted two or more times; and 863 were Baker Acted six or more times in a 21-month period.

During FSA's Mid-Winter conference 2004, Florida Governor Jeb Bush indicated his support, and the Sheriffs have the support of other law enforcement organizations as well as the National Association for the Mentally Ill.

Increased Penalties for Pursuit Situations (SB 1322/HB 295) - SUPPORT

There is a growing problem of people fleeing law enforcement, only to crash and kill or maim innocent third parties or law enforcement officers.

In an effort to deter people, the Florida Sheriffs are supporting increased penalties, making it a felony to flee, with a possible five-year sentence. And if someone intentionally flees and drives in such a reckless manner that a person is injured or killed, they would receive a mandatory three years in prison.

Increased Penalties for Cargo Theft (SB 138/HB177) - SUPPORT

Following an alert by Marion County Sheriff Ed Dean, four years ago, the Florida Sheriffs Association formed the Florida Statewide Commercial Vehicle and Cargo Theft Task Force to combat the increasing levels of tractor-trailer thefts. Recent estimates are that cargo theft costs this nation more than \$25 billion a year, outstripping all other thefts, including employee theft (\$15 billion) and shoplifting (\$9.7 billion). While law

enforcement has been able to reduce thefts in Florida (though it's increasing in other states) through Task Force efforts, the Florida Sheriffs are supporting legislation that would make an even stronger impact. This legislation mandates the use of locking devices on commercial trailers that are left unattended. By creating this prevention measure, it's predicted that theft would decrease dramatically. The bill would also create penalties for those who are in possession of a mechanically-altered fifth wheel commonly used in tractor-trailer thefts.

Miccosukee Indian Reservation Repeal - OPPOSE

The Florida Sheriffs will continue to oppose the repeal of all civil and criminal laws of Florida as they apply on Miccosukee Indian reservations. Repeal would threaten the investigation of crimes on these reservations and tie the hands of our current criminal justice system. If Florida laws do not apply, then a person (including non Indian visitors) who becomes a victim of crime while on Indian land (including the casinos) would have to appeal to the FBI or Tribal Council for assistance. With the heightened Homeland Security issues and increased anti- terrorism efforts, federal investigators are already overloaded. If Florida laws do

not apply on Indian reservations, individuals will have no real protection there.

Pre-Trial Detention Facility Cuts in DJJ Budget - OPPOSE



The Florida Sheriffs will oppose any cuts to the current Department of Juvenile Justice budget that will affect facilities where pre-trial juveniles are detained. Without these facilities, law enforcement officers will have no choice but to release juveniles after they've gone through arrest procedures following a crime. Use of the current facilities has reduced juvenile crime, since it gets the offender off the street and prevents them from committing additional crimes while awaiting trial.

Seniors: Avoid Fraud By Following These Tips

It's no secret that senior citizens are a common target for fraud. And because Florida has one of the highest populations of seniors, we get our fair share of those crimes.

What can you do to avoid becoming a victim? Develop a healthy suspicion of all phone calls or visits that you did not initiate. Always consult a trusted family member before taking financial action with someone you've never done business with before. And don't hesitate to call on law enforcement, if anything seems suspicious.

The Florida Crime Prevention Association offers these tips to avoid fraud:

- Be suspicious of deals offering something for nothing or extremely low rates.
- To verify the identity of repair and delivery persons, inspectors or sales people, call their employer before opening the door of your residence.
- Never reveal personal financial information - including bank account information - over the telephone or to strangers.
- Be wary of those who solicit home repair work by going door-to-door.
- Beware if anyone claims to have found money and offers to share it with you if you will put up good faith money of your own.
- MOST IMPORTANT: If you suspect fraud or any criminal activity, don't be embarrassed or ashamed to report it immediately.

Florida Amber Plan

The AMBER Plan is a voluntary partnership to activate an urgent bulletin in the most serious child-abduction cases.

Broadcasters use the Emergency Alert System to air a description of the abducted child and suspected abductor.

This is the same concept used during severe weather emergencies. The goal of the AMBER Alert is to instantly galvanize the entire community to assist in the search for and safe return of the child.

Started by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Kids, states are encouraged to organize their own Amber Plan and Florida was one of the first to create its own plan.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement in conjunction with the Department of Community Affairs and the Florida Association of Broadcasters, Inc. partnered to create the Florida Amber Plan and now broadcasts critical information of a missing/abducted child believed to be in danger, to the general public via radio and television.

In August 2002, the partnership was expanded to include the Florida Department of Transportation, Florida Highway Patrol and with the Florida Department of Lottery, which will allow for the usage of road signs and lottery machines.

The AMBER Plan was created in 1997 as a powerful legacy to 9-year-old Amber Hagerman, a bright little girl who was kidnapped and brutally murdered after riding her bicycle in Arlington, Texas.

In the fall of 2001, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children launched her namesake, the AMBER Plan, which stands for "America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response nationwide."

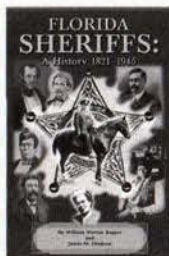

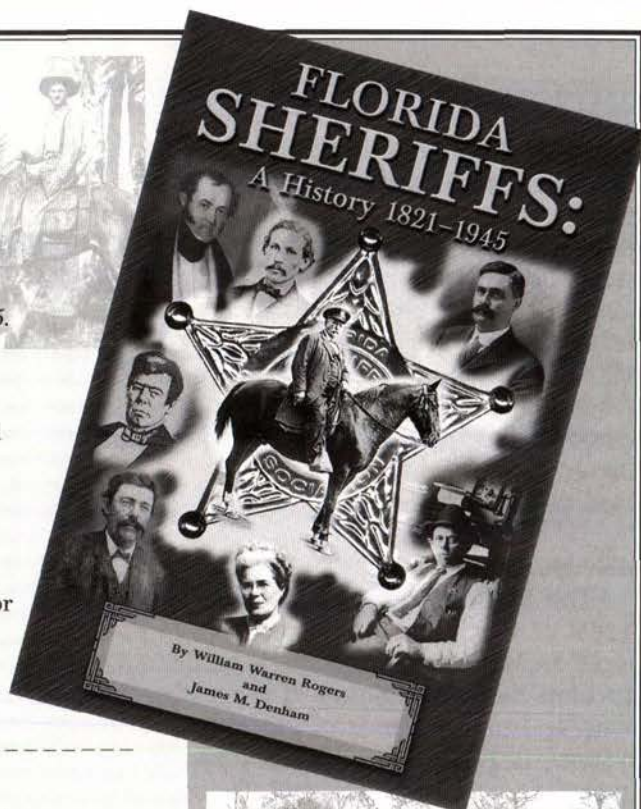

The Florida Sheriffs Association employs an Executive Director and a support staff to carry out the Association's mission and organize conferences.

Who are the members of FSA?

The majority of members are not employed in law enforcement. Approximately 140,000 citizens throughout the state and 3,500 businesses make up the bulk of membership. FSA is one of the rare state Sheriffs' associations that has full, active participation by all Sheriffs in the state.

Where does the money from membership go?

Approximately 70% of FSA's annual expenses goes right into programs that enhance law enforcement in all counties throughout the state. These include training for Sheriffs' Office staff, financing of youth programs, providing professional and legal services to Sheriffs, organizing task forces and hosting Sheriffs' conferences.

The National Charities Information Bureau recommends that nonprofits "spend at least 60% of annual expenses for program activities" for which the money was raised. The Florida Sheriffs Association's track record far exceeds that minimum. FSA does not employ telemarketers or professional fund raisers and welcomes the scrutiny of all Florida citizens on financial matters. A copy of the official registration and financial information may be obtained from the Division of Consumer Services by calling 1-800-435-7352, toll free within the state of Florida. Registration does not imply endorsement, approval, or recommendation by the state.

What are some of FSA's programs and events?

The Florida Sheriffs Association holds two statewide general conferences for Sheriffs and their command staff each year. One is traditionally in the summer, the other in mid-January.

In addition, FSA organizes: Judicial Process Procedures seminar; an Administration Management Training Seminar; an annual Police Vehicle Evaluation and Fleet Management Training Seminar; quarterly Regional Administrative Roundtable Discussion Groups; newly-elected Sheriffs' Basic Institute; annual Statewide Jail

GENERAL

What is the Florida Sheriffs Association?

The Florida Sheriffs Association is a not-for-profit 501(c)3 corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida, plus approximately 3,500 business leaders and 140,000 citizens throughout the state. Founded in 1893, FSA has quietly served the citizens of Florida by supporting the needs of the state's law-enforcement community. It has grown to be one of the largest and most successful state law-enforcement associations in the nation.

Through the Florida Sheriffs Association, the 67 Sheriffs of Florida are given a forum to address lawmakers and push for positive changes in the criminal justice system in our state. FSA also provides Sheriffs' Offices badly needed programs such as affordable training, special task forces and legislative and legal services. Because FSA unites the efforts of all Sheriffs' Offices in the state, the result is a significant cost savings for better quality policing.

How is FSA organized?

FSA is a corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida. To ensure statewide representation, the state is divided into four districts. The corporation is managed by a 17-member Board of Directors - all of whom are Sheriffs. The Board consists of 12 Directors and five officers. Active member Sheriffs in each of the four districts of the state nominate three directors from each district to comprise the 12 members of the board. The five officers may be nominated from any of the four districts and elected by the active member Sheriffs. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board are elected by a simple majority vote of the 12 directors. The five officers included on the Board are: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Immediate Past President, who are elected each year at the Annual Summer Conference by all member Sheriffs present. A Sergeant-at-Arms and a Chaplain are also elected at the Annual Summer Conference and are ex-officio (non-

Administrators Training Workshop; Mid-Level Supervisors Training for Jail Supervisors; Vicarious Liability Reduction School; Court Security Seminar; Extradition Workshop; Drug Enforcement Training; Law Enforcement Management Courses; Seminar for Sheriffs' Assistants and other special programs as needs arise.

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT, BENEFITS

What is the difference between Active Members and other Members of the Association?

Active Members — Only Sheriffs are qualified to be Active Members. Only Active Members hold office and vote.

Honorary Members — Private citizens may be Honorary Members, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Business Members — Businesses have the option of joining at the Gold (\$500), Silver (\$250) or Bronze (\$50) levels. They receive a plaque which designates their level of membership, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Law Enforcement Members — Sheriffs Offices and criminal justice agencies' sworn and non-sworn personnel, volunteers, retirees and auxiliary officers may be Law Enforcement Members, which makes them eligible for special insurance programs, including Line of Duty and accidental death benefits (included in their annual dues). But they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Do Active Members pay dues?

Yes. The dues of Active Members are assessed by the Association and are paid as an expense of the county Sheriff's Office.

How are Honorary Members selected?

Each Sheriff gives the Florida Sheriffs Association permission to mail an invitation for membership to residents of his county and the Association makes arrangements for the use of public sector and commercial mailing lists. It is not a special or exclusive mailing list.

What are the qualifications for Honorary Membership?

Age: There is no age limit.

Sex: Both men and women are eligible for membership.

Character: Anyone who does not have a good reputation or who has been convicted of a felony is not eligible for membership.

Residence: There are no restrictions on residence. We have Honorary Members in many sections of the United States and in several foreign countries.

How is the membership campaign conducted in each county?

The Sheriff approves a letter for mailing to prospective Honorary Members in his county. The list of prospective members is checked against the names of members already on file with the Sheriffs Association and duplications are eliminated. Letters are printed under the Sheriff's name and mailed to all persons on the list. Enclosed with the letter is an application and a business reply envelope which may be returned with annual dues of \$20 to Association headquarters in Tallahassee. When dues are received in Tallahassee, the Association mails to the new member:

- A wallet identification card
- An auto bumper emblem
- An auto tag (optional, for an additional fee)

The member will also receive a year's subscription to our magazines:

THE SHERIFF'S STAR, official publication of the Florida Sheriffs Association (including this special directory edition which is widely used as a source of information on state government).

THE RANCHER, a quarterly report on the progress and activities at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

The Association sends a computer printout containing the names and addresses of the Honorary Members who have joined or renewed that month to the Sheriff, so they have an up-to-date list of the members in the county. Many Sheriffs write new members and thank them for their support.

Can a person's name be removed from the Association mailing list?

Yes. Individuals can either contact the Association and request the removal of their name or they may contact the Mail Preference Service, Direct Marketing Association, P.O. Box 3861, Grand Central Station, New York, NY 10163-3861.

Does the campaign create more work in the Sheriff's Office?

No. All the work is done by the Association, including securing a reputable list of prospective members. A few people may bring their membership dues to the Sheriff's Office instead of mailing them to Tallahassee, but this is handled at no cost to the Sheriff using an Association postage-paid application envelope.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

What if someone sends in more than \$20 for annual dues?

In that case, the Association keeps only \$20 and sends the balance to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. For example, if John Smith sends in \$30 for his dues, the Association deducts \$20 for dues and sends \$10 to the Youth Ranches. Mr. Smith may also purchase an auto tag for \$10 at the same time he joins.

Are Honorary Membership dues deductible for income tax purposes?

Yes. The Florida Sheriffs Association is classified by the IRS as a 501c(3) Charitable Organization which qualifies membership dues to be deductible for income tax purposes.

If a person joins the Association in the middle of the year, does he/she get a full 12 months of membership?

Yes. Memberships run for 12 consecutive months, starting with the month the person joins.

RELATIONSHIP TO YOUTH RANCHES

Explain the relationship between the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., and the Florida Sheriffs Association.

The Florida Sheriffs Association is the parent organization that formed the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., to operate the Boys Ranch near Live Oak, the Youth Ranch in Bradenton/Sarasota, the Youth Villa at Bartow, the Youth Ranch near Safety Harbor, the Youth Camp in Barberville, and Caruth Camp near Inglis/Yankee Town. A portion of FSA dues goes to the Youth Ranches and anything over and above the yearly membership fee goes directly to the Youth Ranches.

The Sheriffs Association office is in Tallahassee while the Youth Ranches' central office is at Boys Ranch. The Sheriffs Association continues to actively support and sponsor the Youth Ranches, but it is also involved in other law enforcement related programs. The Youth Ranches administers its own programs while working closely with the Association staff.

The Association and Youth Ranches are both run by a Board of Directors, but they are not the same board. The Association and the Youth Ranches are registered as Florida charities and are tax exempt.

I'm trying to encourage my grandson to be a law-abiding citizen and thought it would be good for him to become a "junior member" of your organization. Do you have a junior membership?

We welcome all ages as members of the Florida Sheriffs Association. Our affiliation with the Florida Youth Ranches has long assured us of having youthful members in our ranks. And many of our members today – who have been with us 25 years or longer – got started after receiving membership as a "gift" from a grandparent.
