
an opportunity for citizens to better know their chief law enforcement officers in the 67 counties, too.

A message from the President

I've been in law enforcement 46 years and Leon County Sheriff for 10. Every chance I get, I try to educate the public about my position. Why? Because there is no person in your county with more power to directly affect your freedom and your life.

Yes, the Sheriff – as a constitutional officer – is the chief law enforcement officer in the county. We don't answer to the county commission or the police chief. But we *do* answer to the public, and that's something I think people need to hear.

As Sheriffs, we are the only law enforcement officer you get to vote for, including federal and state officials. You don't get to vote for the head of the FBI, CIA or Highway Patrol. There are rare exceptions in police chiefs because of merged city and county governments, but the majority are appointed.

Think about it. We don't *appoint* a president, a governor or an attorney general. They have pretty awesome powers. Law enforcement has awesome powers, too – particularly those affecting your freedom and your life. Just as with those other offices, you need to have control over us. And you do – through the ballot box.

I've had people argue with me over the years, saying the elected Sheriff is too susceptible to corruption. They'll tell me, "we have to appoint a professional and not a politician."

I ask these people to show me where a police chief is *not* susceptible to corruption. Just look at New York, Detroit and Chicago. These big city police departments

have had their share of corruption, and it's been tolerated. But the people don't have to tolerate corruption from a Sheriff. They can just vote him or her out.

That's one of the reasons you're more likely to see the Sheriff at public events more than the police chief – because we must be in touch with the public in order to know what you're thinking, to hear how we're doing.

Erosion of power

While this power of the Sheriff is guaranteed in our constitution, there are some threats to the office you need to know about. One of the biggest threats is aggressive annexation. For example, in the last 20 years, the city of Tallahassee has increased its jurisdiction (including policing powers) from 20 sq. miles to more than 100. That's a slow erosion of the Sheriff's primary policing responsibility. Unfortunately, many citizens aren't even aware that it's going on and before they know it, the law enforcement they've hired – through their vote – is no longer able to serve them. Without realizing it, they've lost their right to vote on this powerful position.

Another threat is the consolidation of city and county governments. As counties are considering merged governments – which I'm all for – we need to assure one thing: Keep the office of Sheriff an elected position, not appointed.

The bottom line is that we need to be aware of the rights given to us as American citizens, including the right to choose the chief law enforcement officer in our county. We need to make sure our cities don't erode control of the Sheriff's Office through aggressive annexation, and when local governments are considering consolidation, we need to preserve our right to choose by keeping the Sheriff an elected position.

As always, I am "proud to serve."

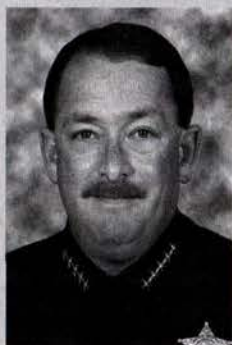

Terms are staggered so that six Board Members are elected in even-numbered years and six in odd-numbered years. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected by the Board for one-year terms and cannot be re-elected to succeed themselves.

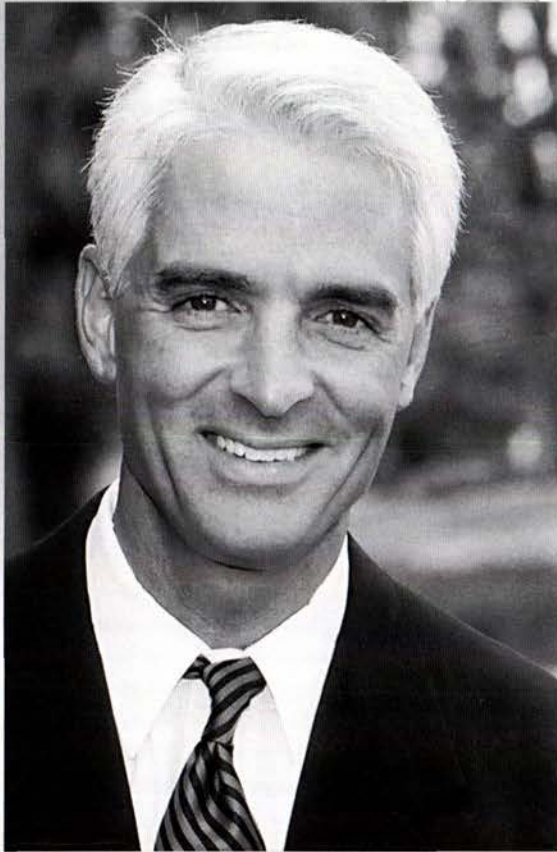

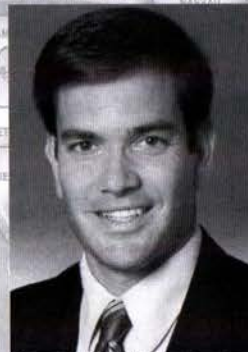

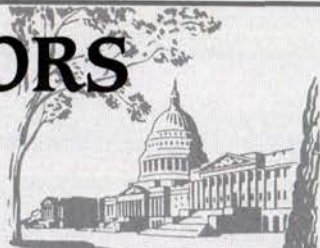

TIPS to Avoid the "Money Drain"

Here are five ways criminals might try to drain your bank account:

1-Finding your PIN. A stolen ATM card is useless without the PIN code, but it's good as gold with it. "Don't keep your PIN in your wallet" is one of the most-repeated, most important... and, sadly, most ignored crime-prevention suggestions of all time.

2-Stealing your checkbook. Some thieves don't swipe your whole purse or even your entire wallet, opting instead to take the checkbook, or just a few checks - probably from the middle of the checkbook. An overdraft notice from the bank may be your first clue that you've crossed paths with a thief.

3-The "Pigeon Drop" scam. Get a manila envelope. Get a few real \$20, \$50, and \$100 bills, and run off a few hundred more on a copy machine. Find a potential victim in a parking lot and ask them if the manila envelope fell from their car. Act surprised when you look inside the envelope and find tens or hundreds of thousands of dollars. Call an "attorney friend" for advice. The victim may be eager to withdraw lots of cash and hand it to you as their share of the "finder's fee," "advance taxes," "earnest money," or whatever else your associate suggested. Now you have a classic case of pigeon drop.

4-The "Lottery Winner" scam. Like the Pigeon Drop, this flim-flam has been successful for decades. Instead of trolling parking lots to meet victims face-to-face, the scammer sends letters and e-mails by the hundreds or thousands. It's profitable if even one letter out of one thousand finds someone willing to send in "processing fees," "taxes" or other funds in false hopes of claiming a fortune. The odds of striking it rich this way are even worse than the odds of winning a real lottery.

5-The counterfeit Certified Check or Money Order. Thanks to computers, scanners, and color printers, it's just as easy to make a bogus cashier's check

or money order at home as it is to print a phony \$100 bill. A common use for fake cashier's checks: the crook answers a classified ad or Internet posting for a car or other expensive item for sale. Posing as a buyer, he explains he accidentally paid too much, and suggests the seller deposit the "cashier's check," and send change via money-gram or money order. A few days later the seller is both helpless and shocked when a notice arrives from the bank: the deposit was counterfeit, and it's far too late to do anything about the withdrawal used to make "change."



Sexual Predator and Sexual Offender Database

We often read in the news of tragedies involving children who become victims of sexual predators or offenders who had a previous record. In order to safeguard our communities, the state of Florida passed a law that made it legal to learn if a person found guilty of previous offenses lives in your neighborhood.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement developed one of the first public access systems for searching a database and determining if you should be taking greater precaution with a person living in your neighborhood, or otherwise exposed to your children.

The database contains public record information on offenders classified as sexual predators and sexual offenders under Florida law because of a conviction for a sex-related crime and/or a specified crime against children.

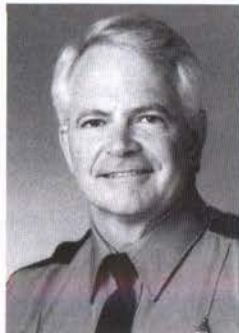

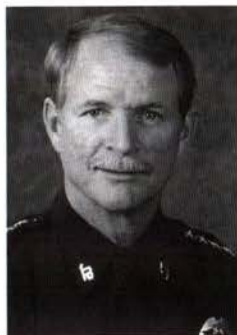

To prevent your identity from being stolen for fraudulent purposes, follow these tips:

- * Don't give out your social security number, unless it's to a trusted agency.
- * Tear into small pieces all credit card offers, ATM receipts, bank statements, credit card statements and other printed materials that have your account numbers on them. Use a paper shredder if possible.
- * Don't send personal information over the Internet, through e-mail, or over cellular phones.
- * Don't use passwords that are obvious—names, birth date, even street addresses. The best passwords mix numbers with upper and lowercase letters.
- * Avoid break-ins by changing your password regularly and memorizing it. If you have several, set up a system for remembering them. Don't write your password on your notebook or a sticky note.

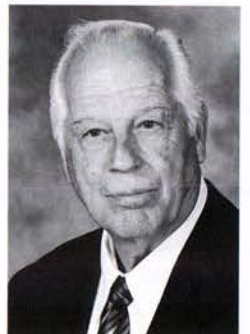

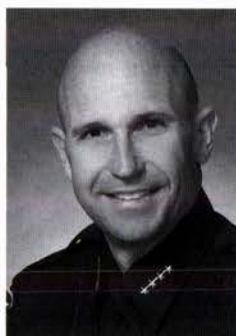

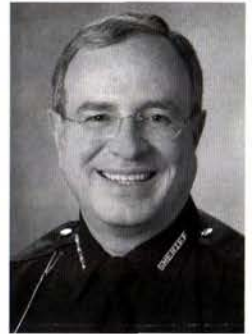

FSA 2007 Legislative Priorities

Sheriffs take the lead on some issues, provide opinions on others

Each legislative session, lawmakers look to the county Sheriffs in their districts, as well as the Florida Sheriffs Association, for counsel on issues that affect public safety. That means FSA must be vigilant in monitoring proposed bills, studying their impact, and communicating the Sheriffs position to lawmakers before they vote.

Through FSA's governmental consultant Frank Messersmith and our legislative committee we are able to track legislation filed almost daily. As of this writing, FSA was tracking almost 200 separate pieces of legislation and that number will likely be about 450-500 by the opening day of session March 6.

FSA has taken a position on the issues below. We appreciate any support you can offer by backing the Sheriffs' positions in correspondence with your legislators.

FSA INITIATIVES

Issue: The effort by the Miccosukee Indians to repeal all Florida criminal and civil law on Indian lands.

Objective: Florida is one of the remaining states that maintains authority on Indian lands, and this would remove any criminal or civil jurisdiction by the state of Florida on Indian lands, including casino operations.

FSA Position: Oppose

Issue: Designation on driver licenses and identification cards for sexual offenders and predators.

Objective: To provide law enforcement with quicker means of identification of sexual offenders and predators.

FSA Position: Support

Issue: Increase Criminal Justice Standards and Training Trust Fund court cost from \$3 to \$5

Objective: To increase annual receipts by an estimated \$3.5 million based on Fiscal Year 05-06 data.

FSA Position: Support

Issue: Florida Retirement System retiree health insurance

Objective: To increase the amount of the health insurance subsidy paid to the retirees of the Florida Retirement System from the current \$5 to \$7 per month/per year of service (proposed over a two year period)

Objective: Increase Retirement contribution to 2%.

Issue: Florida Retirement System classification for Nurses

Objective: To have jail nurses added to the Special Risk status in the Florida Retirement System (FRS).

Issue: Florida Retirement System final average compensation rate

Objective: To calculate the best three years of compensation instead of calculating the current top five years of compensation.

ADDITIONAL SHERIFF-RELATED ISSUES

Issue: FS 112.532 Internal Investigations

Objective: To increase internal investigative time to 270 days. The current law requires Internal Investigations to be completed in 180 days and makes no provisions for extensions due to events beyond the control of the investigating agency.

Issue: Sexual predators

Objective: To establish a mandatory education class dealing with sexual predators on the Internet or physical predators.

FSA Position: Support

Issue: Lunsford Act

Objective: To amend the Lunsford Act passed during the 2005 legislative session to include a Sexual Predator indicator on Driver's Licenses and Identification cards. To also amend calling for the forfeiture of vehicles of sexual predators.

FSA Position: Support

Issue: Red-light running

Objective: To have camera enforcement at red light intersections

FSA Position: Support

Issue: FS 121.0516 Qualifying injured special risk membership

Objective: To provide for certain special risk members (including Sheriffs) who incur an in-the-line-of-duty injury that prohibits the member from providing future special risk services, but does not entitle that member to disability retirement, to continue to accrue retirement benefits at the special risk rate as long as the member remains continuously employed with his or her employer.

FSA Position: Support

Issue: Current law does not permit the law enforcement use of ATV's or golf carts on public roads.

Objective: Amend FS 316.0274 and 316.212 to permit their use.

FSA Position: Support

In addition, the Florida Sheriffs will also support other legislation that provides a tough, common sense approach to fighting crime in Florida.

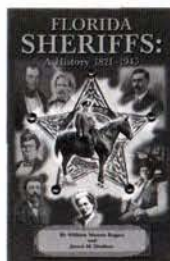
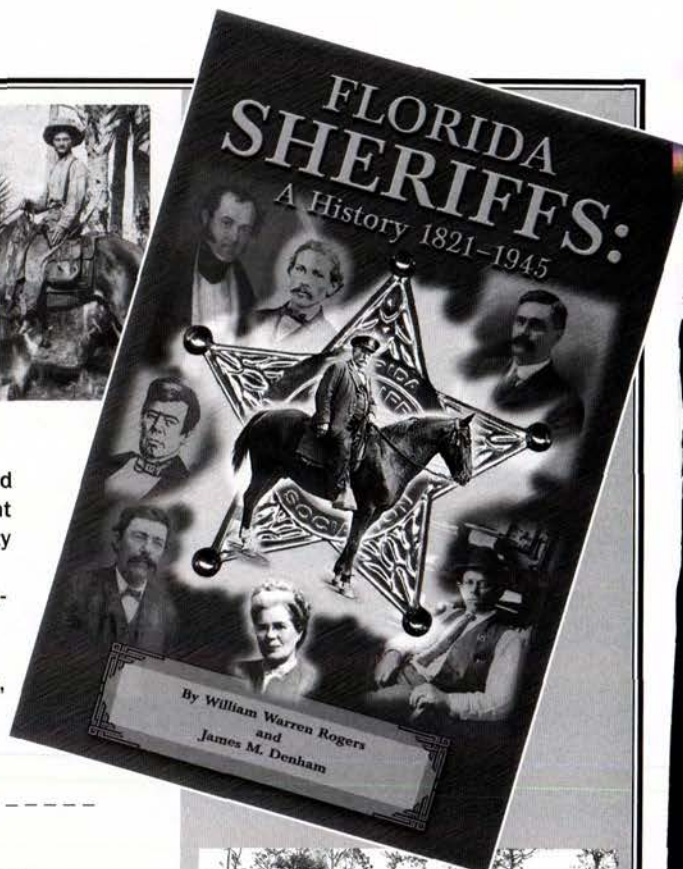

Who are the members of FSA?

The majority of members are not employed in law enforcement. Approximately 130,000 citizens throughout the U.S. (even abroad) including nearly 3,500 businesses make up the bulk of membership.

FSA is one of the rare state Sheriffs' associations nationally that has full, active participation by all Sheriffs in the state.

GENERAL

What is the Florida Sheriffs Association?

The Florida Sheriffs Association is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida, plus approximately 130,000 citizens, business leaders and law-enforcement officers throughout the state.

Founded in 1893, FSA has quietly served the citizens of Florida by supporting the needs of the state's law-enforcement community. It has grown to be the largest and most successful state law-enforcement association in the nation and is Florida's oldest.

Through the Florida Sheriffs Association, the 67 Sheriffs of Florida are given a forum to address lawmakers and push for positive changes in the criminal justice system in our state. FSA also provides Sheriffs' Offices badly needed programs such as affordable training, special task forces and legislative and legal services. Because FSA unites the efforts of all Sheriffs' Offices in the state, the result is a significant cost savings for better-quality policing.

How is FSA organized?

FSA is a corporation made up of the 67 Sheriffs of Florida. To ensure statewide representation, the state is divided into four districts. The corporation is managed by a 17-member Board of Directors - all of whom are Sheriffs. The Board consists of 12 directors and five officers. Active member Sheriffs in each of the four districts of the state nominate three directors from each district to comprise the 12 members of the board. The five officers may be nominated from any of the four districts and elected by the active member Sheriffs. The Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board are elected by a simple majority vote of the 12 directors. The five officers included on the Board are: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Immediate Past President, who are elected each year at the Annual Summer Conference by all member Sheriffs present. A Sergeant-at-Arms and a Chaplain are also elected at the conference and are ex-officio (non-voting) members of the board. The Florida Sheriffs Association employs an Executive Director and a support staff to carry out the Association's

Where does the money from membership dues go?

Approximately 70 percent of FSA's annual expenses go right into programs that enhance law enforcement in all counties throughout the state. These include training for Sheriffs' Office staff, financing of youth programs, providing professional and legal services to Sheriffs, organizing task forces and hosting Sheriffs' conferences.

The National Charities Information Bureau recommends that nonprofits "spend at least 60 percent of annual expenses for program activities" for which the money was raised. The Florida Sheriffs Association's track record has traditionally exceeded that minimum.

FSA does not employ telemarketers or professional fund raisers and welcomes the scrutiny of all Florida citizens on financial matters. A copy of the official registration and financial information may be obtained from the Division of Consumer Services by calling 1-800-435-7352, toll free within the state of Florida. Registration does not imply endorsement, approval, or recommendation by the state.

What are some of FSA's programs and events?

The Florida Sheriffs Association holds two statewide general conferences for Sheriffs and their command staff each year. One is traditionally in the summer; the other in late January.

In addition, FSA organizes and hosts (or co-hosts) annually: Florida Model Jail Standards Jail Inspector Certification Course, Florida Model Jail Standards Jail Medical Inspector Certification Course, FSA Jail Administrators' Workshop, Training Conference for the Sheriff's Assistant, Administrative Management Training Seminar and an Annual Car Evaluation and Fleet Management Training Seminar.

FSA also periodically hosts or co-hosts the following: Newly Elected Sheriffs' Basic Institute (every 4 years), Court Security Seminar, Drug Enforcement Training, Extradition Workshop (biannually with the Governor's Office), Judicial Process Procedures Seminar, Regional Administrative Roundtable Discussion Groups and a Vicarious Liability Reduction School.

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT, BENEFITS

What is the difference between "Active" Members and other members of the Association?

Active Members — Only Sheriffs are qualified to be Active Members. Only Active Members hold office and vote.

Honorary Members — Private citizens may be Honorary Members, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Business Members — Businesses have the option of joining at the Gold (\$500), Silver (\$250) or Bronze (\$50) levels. They receive a plaque which designates their level of membership, but they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.

Law Enforcement Members — Sheriffs Offices and criminal justice agencies' sworn and non-sworn personnel, volunteers, retirees and auxiliary officers may be Law Enforcement Members, which makes them eligible for special insurance programs, including Line of Duty and accidental death benefits (included in their annual dues). But they are not eligible to vote or hold office in the Association.



Do Active Members pay dues?

Yes. The dues of Active Members are assessed by the Association and are paid as an expense of the county Sheriff's Office.

How are Honorary Members selected?

Each Sheriff gives the Florida Sheriffs Association permission to mail an invitation for membership to residents of his or her county and the Association makes arrangements for the use of public sector and commercial mailing lists. It is not a special or exclusive mailing list.

What are the qualifications for Honorary Membership?

Age: There is no age limit.

Sex: Both men and women are eligible for membership.

Character: Anyone who does not have a good reputation or who has been convicted of a felony is not eligible for membership.

Residence: There are no restrictions on residence. We have Honorary Members in many sections of the United States and in several foreign countries.

How is the membership campaign conducted in each county?

The Sheriff approves a letter for mailing to prospective Honorary Members in his or her county. The list of prospective members is checked against the names of members already on file with the Sheriffs Association and we attempt to remove any duplications. Letters are printed under the Sheriff's name and mailed to all persons on the list. Enclosed with the letter is an application and a business reply envelope which may be returned with annual dues of \$25 to Association headquarters in Tallahassee. When dues are received in Tallahassee, the Association mails to the new member:

- A wallet identification card
- An auto window decal
- A year's subscription to the bi-monthly *Sheriff's Star* magazine and quarterly *Rancher*.



The Sheriff's Star is the official publication of the Florida Sheriffs Association and includes this special directory edition "The Annual Guide," which is widely used as a source of information on state government. *The Rancher* is a quarterly report on the progress and activities at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Members also have the option of purchasing an auto tag (for an additional fee) to display on the front of their vehicle.



Can a person's name be removed from the Association mailing list?

Yes. Individuals can either contact the Association and request the removal of their name or they may contact the Mail Preference Service, Direct Marketing Association, P.O. Box 3861, Grand Central Station, New York, NY 10163-3861.

Does the campaign create more work in the Sheriff's Office?

No. All the work is done by the Association, including securing a reputable list of prospective members. A few people may bring their membership dues to the Sheriff's Office instead of mailing them to Tallahassee, but this is handled at no cost to the Sheriff using an Association postage-paid application envelope.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

What if someone sends in more than \$25 for annual dues?

Many times people want to do more to support law enforcement in Florida and they send additional funds. Unless it is specified for a certain purpose within the FSA mission, it goes into the general fund to support programs and services that improve law enforcement in Florida counties.

Are Honorary Membership dues deductible for income tax purposes?

Yes. The Florida Sheriffs Association is classified by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization which qualifies membership dues to be deductible for income tax purposes.

RELATIONSHIP TO YOUTH RANCHES

Please explain the relationship between the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches Inc. and the Florida Sheriffs Association.

The Florida Sheriffs Association is the parent organization that formed the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches Inc. to operate the Boys Ranch near Live Oak, the Youth Ranch in Bradenton/Sarasota, the Youth Villa at Bartow, the Youth Ranch near Safety Harbor, the Youth Camp in Barberville, and Caruth Camp near Inglis/Yankee Town. A portion of FSA membership dues is allotted to help the Youth Ranches. The Sheriffs Association office is in Tallahassee, while the Youth Ranches' central office is at Boys Ranch. The Sheriffs Association continues to actively support and sponsor the Youth Ranches, but it is also involved in other law enforcement-related programs. The Youth Ranches administers its own programs while working closely with the Association staff.

The Association and Youth Ranches are both run by a Board of Directors, but they are not the same board. The Association and the Youth Ranches are registered as Florida charities and are tax exempt.

I'm trying to encourage my grandson to be a law-abiding citizen and thought it would be good for him to become a "junior member" of your organization. Do you have a junior membership?
